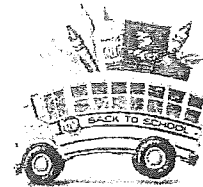


Abraham Lincoln Elementary
Fourth Grade Supply List
2017-2018



Note: The following items are included in the optional school supply order from Innisbrook.

- 24 #2 pencils (regular or mechanical) with erasers
- 12 erasable, *non-clickable* blue or black pens
(Frixion pens work the best, but are more expensive.)
- 12 red pens
- 2-4 ultra-fine black Sharpie pens
- 2 highlighters
- 1 package of Post-it notes (Room 207 and 210 only)
- 1 pack of looseleaf wide-ruled notebook paper (boys only)
- 1 four-pack fine-tip dry erase markers
- 2 two-pocket folders (**Red only**)
- 1 box of 24 colored pencils (**no crayons or markers**)
- 7 one-subject, wide rule, spiral notebooks (**non-perforated**)
- 1 durable plastic expandable file folder with at least 8-10 pockets (**no Trapper Keepers!**)
- 2 pairs of scissors
- 6 large glue sticks (**no liquid glue, paste, or gel glue**)
- 1 medium-large-sized supply pouch with zipper (**cloth if possible, no plastic boxes**)
- 1 pencil sharpener (**non-battery operated with shaving holder**)

Note: These items are not included in the optional school supply order program from Innisbrook, but are **still required** for students entering 4th grade.

- 1 Texas Instruments 503SV calculator
- 2 family-sized boxes of tissue
- 1 container of baby wipes (**non-toxic**)
- 1 small Thesaurus
- 1 regular size clipboard
- 1 pack white ruled 3x5 index cards (100 count)
- 1 four-pack of large chisel tip dry erase markers - **girls only (Not for Room 211 students)**
- 1 container of Clorox wipes - **boys only**
- 1 pair of clean ankle socks for slate board erasers (**last name labeled in Sharpie**)
- The Cricket in Times Square* by George Selden (**Summer Reading**)
- The Seven Wonders of Sassafras Springs* by Betty G. Birney (**Do Not Read!!!**)
- Maniac Magee* by Jerry Spinelli (**Do Not Read!!!**)
- The Watsons go to Birmingham-1963* by Christopher Paul Curtis **210 and 211 (Do Not Read!!!)**
- From The Mixed-up Files of Mrs. Basil E. Frankweiler* by E.L. Konigsburg (**Do Not Read!!!**)
- One roll of paper towels-**girls only**

 - Mr. Thompson's class - **required, original blue color only**
 - Ms. Pippen's class - **optional, original blue color only**
 - Ms. Hime's class - **suggested, any color**

- Please do not purchase an assignment notebook for your child. The PTA will provide one for each student during the first week of school.**

Important Summer Responsibilities For Incoming Fourth Graders

- 1) Students must have all **basic multiplication facts** memorized for the first day of school. Students should be able to complete 100 basic facts in 5 minutes. Feel free to visit the website http://www.math-drills.com/multiplication/mult_v100_0109_0110_all.pdf for practice tests that can be printed out and used throughout the summer. Other helpful resources for multiplication practice include:
 - Multiplication flashcards
 - Number Top-It (Like “War” with standard card deck, each player chooses two cards as factors)
 - Interactive multiplication apps and websites

- 2) Students must practice **neatly writing in cursive** and be ready to write in cursive on the first day of school. When writing, remember the “Five S’s”: size, shape, spacing, slant and seat position.
 - Websites such as www.handwritingforkids.com and www.kidzone.ws/cursive/index.htm have helpful online and printable resources.
 - Review Loops and Groups workbooks.
 - We also encourage the purchase of Mavis Beacon to develop keyboarding skills. Information can be located at <http://tinyurl.com/k2haldd>.

- 3) Students must read *The Cricket in Times Square* by George Selden and turn in the attached **book review** on the first day of school. Students should be prepared to discuss the novel during the first week of school as we are planning several activities pertaining to the novel.

- 4) Students must complete the **Everyday Math Assessment Packet** in order to review and practice the concepts learned in 3rd grade. This will be collected by your 4th grade teacher on the first day of school.

Spread these assignments out over the summer. Don’t wait until the last minute! By doing these activities, you will ensure a successful start to fourth grade. Thank you in advance for making sure that your child is prepared. Have a great summer break and see you on September 5, 2017!

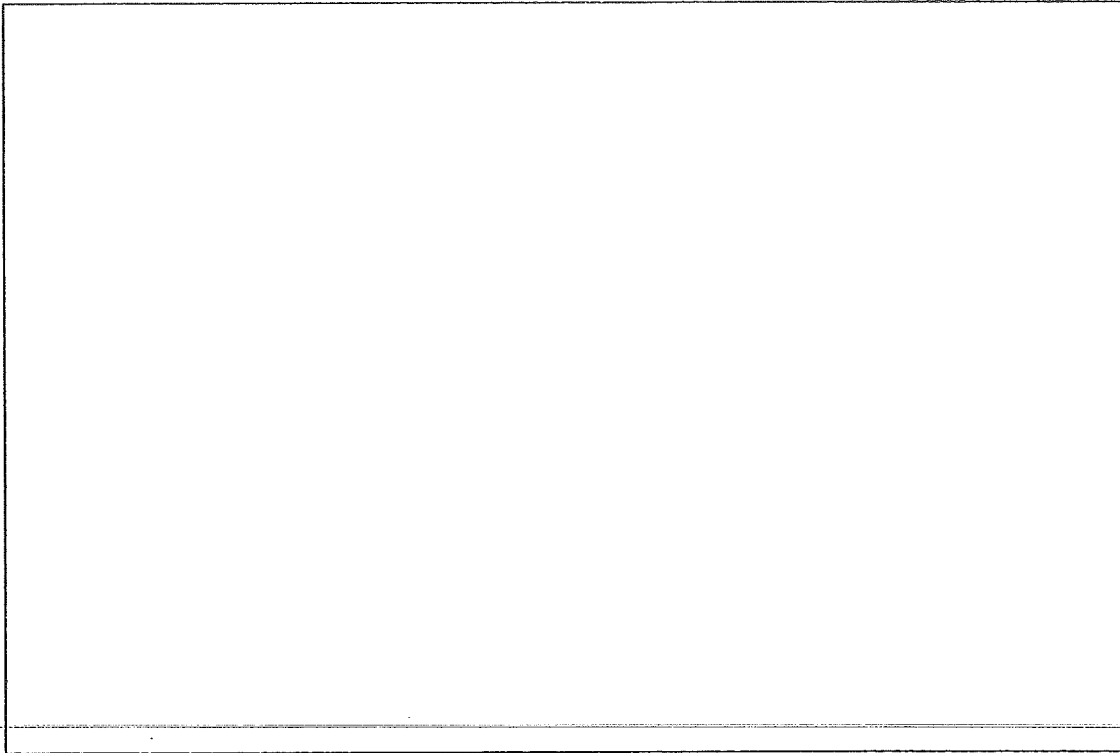
