

Chicago Public Library Library Card Campaign



Does your child have a Chicago Public Library card? If your child does not have one, please take the time to fill out an application and have your child return it to his or her language arts teacher (or homeroom teacher for grades K-5) by October 15th. The library cards will be delivered to our school sometime in November.

If your child has a card but it has been misplaced, please fill out the application to get a new card. You will not have to pay the card replacement fee if you fill out the application and return it to the school. Library cards expire every three years. If you think the card is expired, please fill out an application.

Please make sure you include an email on your application so that the library can email due date reminders and let you know when materials you have placed on hold have arrived.

There are so many advantages to having a library card:

- You can check out up to 50 books at a time.
- You can check up to 10 audiobooks, DVDs and CDs at a time.
- You can download eBooks and audiobooks.
- You can read and download hundreds of magazines and newspapers.
- You can access educational databases for help with research projects.
- You can learn languages using Little Pim or Mango Languages.
- You can access the Chicago Tribune Historical Archive, which goes back to 1849.
- You can download music, TV shows and movies from Hoopla.
- You can access Brainfuse for help with homework.
- You can use the card to reserve a computer at the library.

Our goal is for 100% of Lincoln students to have a Chicago Public Library card. Please help us make this possible.
